1 Watch Out for New Signs

Two important **New Signs** on the Downtown Bike Network are:

Yield to Bicycles

- This sign tells drivers to yield to cyclists when turning across a bike lane.
- Here, the road will be marked with green stripes.



No Right Turn on a Red

- Cars are not permitted to turn right across a bike lane on a red light.
- Cyclists can turn right on red lights at these intersections.



2 Don't Stop on the Green Paint



Green Paint indicates points on the road where drivers and cyclists may cross paths.

- Avoid stopping on the green paint.
- Stop behind the white line of the Bike Box.
- Watch for cyclists wherever you see green.

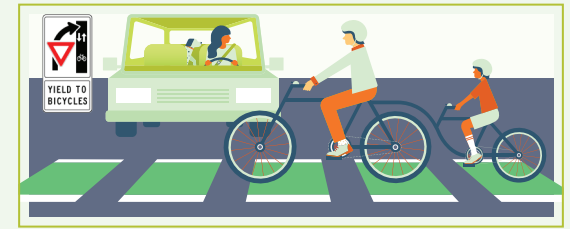
3 Shoulder Check and Look Both Ways



Cyclists will be traveling quickly and coming from **both directions** in the bike lanes.

- Watch for cyclists in the bike lanes and on the roads.
- Shoulder check and look both ways for cyclists before turning across a bike lane.

4 Yield to Cyclists when Turning Across the Bike Lanes



Striped Green Paint indicates that a bike lane is crossing an intersection or accessway such as an alleyway or entrance into a parking lot.

- Look both directions and shoulder check before crossing the bike lane.
- Yield to cyclists in the bike lane and pedestrians in the crosswalk.
- Do not block the bike lane.

4 Things to Know

These important tips will help you comfortably navigate the Network in your car:

- 1 Watch for new signs.
- 2 Don't stop on the green paint.
- 3 Shoulder check and look both ways.
- 4 Yield to cyclists when turning across the bike lanes.
