Important Definitions

Call for Service: A citizen or police generated call that results in an event. These situations are fluid and emotionally charged and initial complainant accounts are often fractured, evolving and lacking context. Changing dynamics may result in changes in both priority of dispatch and event type over the course of a call (e.g. event type at dispatch is Trouble with Person but changes to an event type of Assault upon arrival and evaluation by an EPS member).

Occurrence: An incident or a series of connected incidents reported to police that results in the creation of a police report. An occurrence can be criminal requiring investigation or non-criminal requiring follow-up.

Understanding the Data

Real world policing data is dynamic and complex. Below is a simplified view of how a call from a community member, an incident witnessed by police, or a crime reported online flows through our systems and is displayed on the Statistics Page and Community Safety Map.

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

What purpose does the Community Safety Data Portal serve?
The Community Safety Data Portal was specifically designed in support of EPS' vision of a forward-thinking police service that strengthens public trust by addressing crime, harm and disorder. Our mission is to be relentless on crime and a leading partner in building community safety starts with transparency and empowering our community with factual and timely community safety information.

Why does EPS share crime maps and other data with the public via the Community Safety Data Portal?
This new platform allows EPS to be more transparent, with the goal of improving the relationship between officers and citizens while building stronger and safer communities together. EPS hopes the Community Safety Data Portal will encourage the public to take an active role in community safety and crime prevention.

What types of occurrences can I see on EPS' Community Safety Map?
The data represented on the map includes but is not limited to homicide, robbery, drug/weapon violations, family/sexual violence, mischief, and various thefts. For a better understanding of the data, please view the [Glossary of Occurrence Types](#) on the [Resources](#) page.

Are all incidents of crime included on the Community Safety Data Portal?
All incidents (criminal and non-criminal) for which a police report was filed are included. Each occurrence is mapped to the nearest intersection in order to protect individuals' privacy and safety. For privacy reasons or to protect the integrity of police investigations, certain types of occurrence are not visible on the map. All occurrence types are included on the [Statistics](#) page.

How often is the data uploaded?
While the data is uploaded daily, please be aware that there is a 24-hour to 48-hour delay before occurrences are published to the map. For example, occurrences reported on a Monday will be available on the map by Wednesday morning.

Many incidents have occurred in my neighbourhood. What does that mean?
Occurrences in your neighbourhood can be both criminal and non-criminal. Not all police activity is in response to crime. Regardless of where you live, the potential for police activity exists.

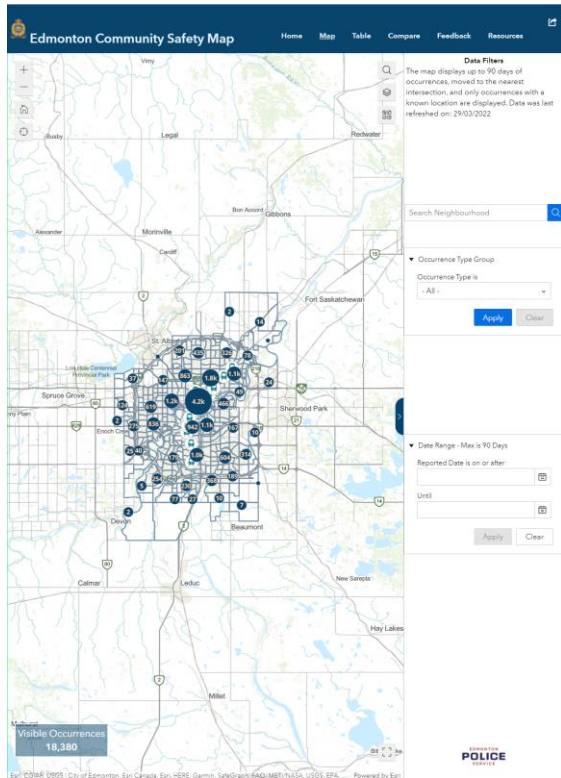

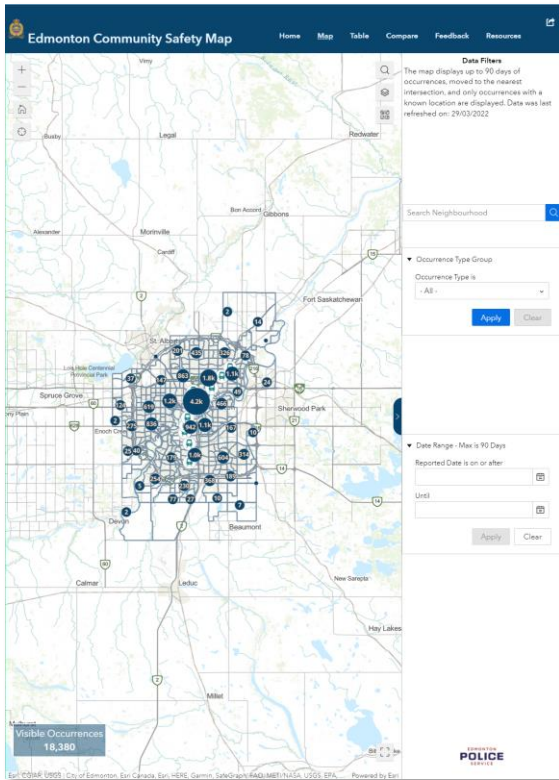

Edmonton Community Safety Map: Map Page



- Maps up to the prior 90 days of occurrences.
- Allows for searching, adjusting layers and basemaps, filtering by occurrence type, neighbourhood and date range.
- Selecting a neighbourhood will zoom the map to that area. Click the trash can icon to clear.
- Selecting an occurrence type will hide all other occurrences from the map.
- Changing the date range will hide occurrences that happened outside the specified time period.

Edmonton Community Safety Map: Map Page



The Home tool returns the map to its default view.



The Locate tool zooms the map to your current location.



The Search tool allows for searching by place name or address.




The Layer tool provides access to other layers of information for the map

- Data can be searched and downloaded.
- Selecting a record on the table zooms the map to the record.
- Zooming the map limits the records on the table.




The Search tool filters the list of records to only those containing the search term.

The Clear Selection tool unselects any selected records.

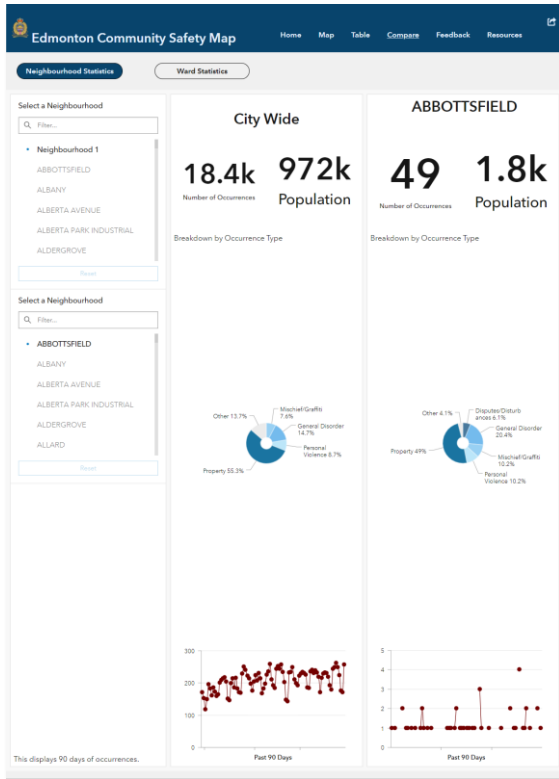


The Refresh tool reloads the table, maintaining the current selections.

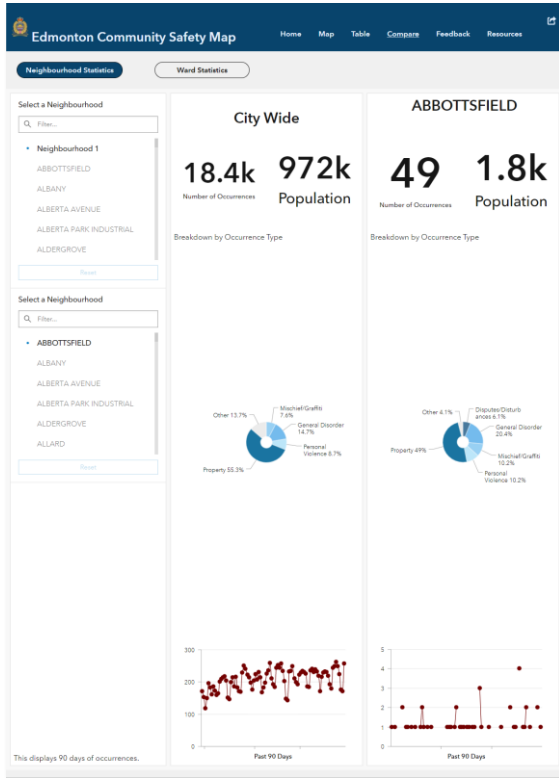


- Enables comparisons of occurrence statistics between neighbourhoods, wards, and the city as a whole.



- Selection tools on the left determine which neighbourhoods or wards are compared.
- Data can be filtered by occurrence category by clicking on the ring charts. Clicking outside a ring chart unselects any chosen occurrence categories.
- Charts at the bottom show when the selected occurrences happened over the past 90 days.

Glossary of Occurrence Types (Click on the category to view types)

Disorder: Drugs/Weapons Non-Violent Traffic Violent

CHECK ON WELFARE: An incident where police have been asked to check on the wellbeing of an individual for fear they are injured or may become injured. This includes cases where a family member, neighbour, or friend reports concern for someone, and it also includes individuals self-reporting that they may harm themselves or are in a dangerous situation.

DISTURBANCE: A verbal or physical altercation which disrupts the peace of those around, or a single person disturbing the peace.

INTOXICATED PERSON: A person intoxicated by alcohol or drugs causing a disturbance or interrupting the peace and quiet.

LABOUR DISPUTE: A situation required the police to keep the peace at a workplace while a strike or protest is ongoing.

MENTAL HEALTH: An incident involving a person who appears to lack essential reasoning faculties or who exhibits bizarre behaviour.

MISSING PERSON: The report of a missing or found person without evidence of criminal activity. For example a child that wandered away from adult supervision.

PUBLIC HEALTH ACT: Any type of enforcement of the Public Health Act.

STAND BY TO PREVENT: When officers are required to stand by in order to prevent the breach of peace. For example in situations where two parties are known to dislike each other but must interact to complete a necessary task (i.e. estranged family members dividing property).

TRESPASSING: An incident where a person is intruding on private premises.

TROUBLE WITH PERSON: A call for service involving a person causing a nuisance or about to commit a crime.

WORKPLACE ACCIDENT: Any injury sustained at a worksite, up to but not including death.

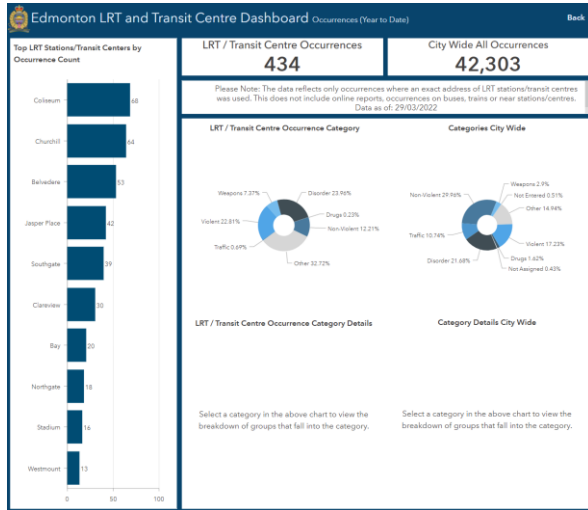
